The Atlanta Botanical Garden-Gainesville

The Atlanta Botanical Garden-Gainesville opened in May of 2015 as a satellite location of the Atlanta garden. The 165 acres of land was given as a gift in 2001 from the Smithgall family to help preserve it for future generations. About 20 acres has been developed at this time including a half mile entry road, visitor center, 2000 seat amphitheater, event lawn and perennial border, main woodland garden, 1.5 miles hiking trails, and a Children's Garden. Much of the plant material in the garden was propagated and grown on site at the greenhouse/ nursery facility in the years leading up to opening. This helped create an extremely diverse garden that has established quickly over the last 7 years. Specialty collections include Hamamelis, Magnolia, Hydrangea, and species Acer. Both of the Magnolia and Acer collection are part of a nationally accredited multi-institution collection.
