IPPS-SR Early-Career Professional Opportunities

Margie Jenkins IPPS-SR Industry Scholarship Award

The award was established in 2021 to honor Margie Jenkins. Its purpose is to enable individuals who are employed or self-employed in the nursery/green industry to attend an International Plant Propagators' Society – Southern Region of North America (IPPS-SRNA) meeting for their first time. The recipient receives a complimentary full conference registration. Margie Jenkins was a long-time member of the IPPS-SR-NA. She started her nursery/green industry career later in life. She became a mentor to everyone and was very passionate about plants. Under her leadership, the Jenkins Farm and Nursery enlarged and prospered, and "Ms. Margie" became recognized as a botanical authority across the Gulf States. She was a frequent guest speaker and lecturer at nursery and botanical organizations. She received awards from many nursery associations, and was the first woman to be inducted into the Louisiana's Department of Agriculture Hall of Distinction. Ms. Margie was passionate about mentoring and introducing new plants to the green industry. She exemplified the IPPS motto: "To Seek and Share."

Vivian Munday IPPS-SR Young Horticulture Professional Scholarship Work Program

This program began in 1997, as the Vivian Munday Undergraduate Awards program in memory of Dr. Vivian Munday, Professor of Horticulture, University of Georgia. Dr. Munday was passionate about undergraduate students, all flora and fauna, the IPPS-SR and her job as editor for 18 years. The scholarship work program supported worthy undergraduates and introduced them to the IPPS-SR and the green industry. A requirement of the award was that applicants be full-time students in two or four year programs. The students were required to be at the conference meetings to introduce them to this great organization and to reach out to them and hopefully attract them as new members. The scholarships were \$1,000 with a \$500 travel stipend per student. Some 3-5 students majoring in horticulture/agriculture were chosen each year.

In 2013, the program was reorganized as the Vivian Munday Young Horticultural Professional Scholarship Work Program. It includes students in horticulture/agriculture with career interest in the green industry/plant propagation. The program is geared to introduce students to career opportunities in the green industry, horticulture and plant propagation. Awardees actively participate at the annual meeting - helping with and attending the educational sessions, nursery tours, and general assistance with running the conference. A goal is to enhance educational interaction with the students and green industry professionals. Through greater engagement/participation between students and professionals – awardees are encouraged to become future members of the society. There are four individuals (4-pack) selected. The awardees receive free registration, banquet ticket, and tours, and co-share a hotel room at the conference. The Vivian Munday IPPS-SR Young Horticulture Professional Scholarship Work Program Selection Committee is composed of the three most recent IPPS-SR Fellows.

Early Career IPPS-SR Professional Exchange Program

In 2013, the IPPS-SR began to participate in the Early-Career Propagator Exchange program with the European Region. This is an outreach program to attract and educate early career nursery/green industry professionals. The goal is to interchange young nursery/green industry professionals between international regions and give an early career professional the opportunity to learn about the industry/profession in another world region of the IPPS. The IPPS-SR awardee is currently hosted by the European Region. While visiting the region, the awardee will attend the regional conference and visit nurseries. The IPPS-SR provides \$2,000 to the awardee to cover travel expenses. Partial reimbursements are available to SR hosts to cover some of their travel expenses related to hosting the European Region awardee when needed.

The Charles IPPS-SR Student Research Awards Program

This program began in 1985 with the objectives to: 1) stimulate student research and career interest in the propagation and production of landscape plants, and the green industry and 2) raise the quality of educational programs through student participation and interaction with the membership at annual meetings of the IPPS-SR. Awards are 1st - \$1,000, 2nd - \$500, 3rd - \$250 plus \$500 travel stipend for each awardee. In 2007 the program began supporting up to 4 graduate post presenters at \$500 travel for each awardee. In some years, as many as 15 students have applied to compete (paper and oral presentation). There is a Scholarship and Awards Committee composed of industry and academia who evaluate and rank the student research papers. Students with the top-ranked papers are invited to make oral presentations at the annual meeting - from which the final election is made. Remaining students are encouraged to give poster presentations. In 2016, the IPPS-SR Student Research Award program was named the Charlie Parkerson IPPS-SR Student Research Awards Program.

In 2016, the IPPS-SR Student Research Award program was named the Charlie Parkerson SR-IPPS Student Research Awards Program and in 2024 the name was changed at the request or Mr. Parkerson to also honor Dr. Charles Gilliam his longtime friend.

Coach Vince Dooley IPPS-SR Student Scholarship

This program was established in 2023 in honor of the late Coach Vince Dooley from University of Georgia. Recipients do not work the conference but rather use this opportunity to network with IPPS members and identify employment opportunities. Eligibility is for Juniors or Seniors in 2 or 4-year ag science/horticulture programs. Scholarship covers full registration, hotel, and travel (actual flight costs or mileage reimbursement), plus \$250 spending money. Awardee will share a hotel room with other scholarship winners.
